## Updates at a glance

**Coronavirus Update:** Along with essential business, we are now open for lap swim, hall rental bookings for 2021, ID cards, and ticket sales. Business hours are Monday through Friday, 9:00am to 5:00pm, except for holidays. Lap swim is restricted; please call for more information or to reserve a lane at 674-4444 dept. 2. Please avoid unnecessary contact by setting up autopay for your dues, or pay by mail, or deposit at the main office drop box, (no cash).

## FIREWORKS ARE ILLEGAL



You can be held criminally liable for the possession, storage, or use of illegal fireworks. Illegal fireworks includes fountains, sparklers, aerial fireworks, and other consumer fireworks. Homeowners and renters may be prosecuted with fines ranging from \$500 to \$2,000, even if the fireworks are only stored and not ignited. And, with enough in possession, that misdemeanor may turn into a felony.

Residents with photos or videos which can be used as evidence are encouraged to turn them in to HPD. If you call 911 to report illegal fireworks, please be prepared with as much specific information as possible such as address, description of violator, vehicles involved, etc.

Regular firecrackers are approved with restrictions including a permit and valid ID. Permits are available online at [honolulu.gov/hfdfireworks](http://honolulu.gov/hfdfireworks). You must have your permit to purchase and use firecrackers on Oahu. Each permit is nontransferable and allows a one-time purchase of up to 5,000 firecrackers. Even with a permit, firecrackers can only be set off from 9:00pm New Year's Eve to 1:00am New Year's Day.

Be considerate! Fireworks cause huge health concerns for people with asthma, COPD, and other respiratory issues. The COVID-19 pandemic amplifies these concerns. Dogs in fear run away and get lost or struck by cars; pets are terrified to the point of illness. Our servicemen and women as well as others with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) may also be affected by the shrill and booms of illegal fireworks.

## HOLIDAY DECORATIONS

Sharing joyful décor during the holidays makes everyone feel festive. Exterior decorations may be installed 30 days before the holiday and must be removed 15 days after the holiday.



# Ongoing Roadwork in Kapolei

Roadwork in Kapolei will continue through February 2022. The two phases of construction will start with sidewalks, curbs, gutters, and catch basin decks. The second phase will include road paving, striping and sign installation. Be aware of pedestrian detours and traffic control signs.

On-street parking will be prohibited in active construction areas. Please observe the dates and times on the posted roadway signs as illegally parked vehicles will be towed at the owner’s expense. Allow for additional delay as partial road or lane closures will become necessary. Roads and areas affected are shown in yellow on the map, (right).
